








Approach and Guiding Questions

Priorities:

- Action-oriented
- Guided by ceremony, song, language and storytelling
- Collaboration of like-minded salmon people, communities, organizations and governments
- Collective sharing in order to identify next steps

Questions to guide discussions

- 1. How can Indigenous Salmon Peoples (ISP) exercise rights and jurisdiction internationally?
- 2. How can ISP work across different scales and jurisdictional boundaries?
- 3. How can ISP draw from laws, legislation, and frameworks to advance Indigenous-led interests?
- 4. What could be featured within an international ISP declaration or other outcomes?



Empowering Indigenous Knowledge cont.


Hopeful restoration work and research projects:

- collaboration across disciplines
- upholding the need to learn from Elders and traditions



Research needs for the future

- recruitment of young researchers to the field
- utilise wide variety of methods
- journalism, poetry, storytelling, monitoring, interviews, governance studies and much more!









Next Steps

How can ISP continue to support each other?

- Is there support for a more formalized followup in the future (e.g. political)?
- How can participants bring the proceedings back to their respective leadership, decisionmaking authorities, venues and tables for additional dialogue?
- How can we provide the structure and process to connect Indigenous peoples internationally?
- How can we increase the participation of ISP in state-led salmon management?
